- Referrals to partner agencies who provide a range of services

Basic Computer Class/Lab

Many jobs, as well as training and employment services, require a basic understanding of computers.

- You can attend this Lab if you need assistance with the following:

 - How to build Resumes or Cover Letter and completing Online Job Applications
- Each class is 90 minutes and offered in both English and Spanish
 - Walk-ins are welcome

General Education Diploma

Employers and educational institutions view the GED® to be the same as a high school diploma and acquiring a GED® can open doors to new opportunities.

Included in the program:

- Entrance testing to determine areas of focus
- Instructor led terms at Rogue Community College (RCC), or self-guided online courses
- Practice tests, which must be passed before GED® exams
- Four subject tests that must be passed are Language, Social Studies, Science, and Mathematics
- Study and take the tests online through GED.com



EMP®WER



Life Coaching

Through individualized coaching sessions participants focus on areas they currently feel stuck and unable to make positive progress.

Areas of focus may include stress, parenting, structure, anxiety, time management, conquering self-limiting beliefs, sticking with healthy habits, and more.

Participants work with a Certified Professional Coach who operates from a solution-focused platform while bringing together brain science, human behavior, trauma-informed care, mindfulness, emotional intelligence, and research.

iMatchSkills Registration is required to enroll in Life Coaching.

English Language Learners (ELL)

This program helps people whose first language is not English gain a better understanding of the language.

Included in the program:

- Funding terms at Rogue Community College (RCC)
- Two levels of coursework
 - Beginning/low intermediate
 - High intermediate/advanced

National Career Readiness Certificate

The NCRC assesses current comprehension of:

- Workplace Documents
- Graphic Literacy
- Applied Math

Benefits of taking the NCRC:

- Validates your work-readiness skills to employers
- Increases chances of entry into some WorkSource programs

NCRC Practice Tests

Talk to your Career Coach about getting some practice materials

Each of the 3 tests takes 55 minutes. You may take tests on different days. One day advanced registration required.

PAID EMPLOYMENT AND EDUCATIONAL SUPPORTS



Apprenticeships

Apprenticeships are an entry point into many high paying and stable skilled trades positions.

Exposure to high demand trades such as plumbing, electrical, sheet metal, construction, machining, maintenance, pipe fitting, and HVAC

- A paid work experience
- 144 hours of class time per year for four years
- Pre-apprenticeship program recommended for those without construction experience

Unemployment Insurance (UI)

Unemployment insurance provides money to people who have lost their jobs or have had their hours reduced through no fault of their own. Weekly payments of unemployment insurance benefits support people as they actively look for work.

If you have lost your job or if your employer has cut your hours, you should apply for unemployment insurance benefits. Unemployment agents will help determine if you are eligible for weekly payments.

- Up to six months of benefits may be paid
- UI can be claimed even if you are working part time
- Create your account in <u>Frances</u>

Self Employment Assistance (SEA)

Self Employment Assistance allows you to receive unemployment insurance while starting your own business.

- Business earnings do not subtract from unemployment benefits
- Work search requirements are waived
- The Small Business Development Center (SBDC) provides counseling and training
- Some of the requirements for the program include:
 - Must apply for and be accepted into the program
 - Must be eligible for and receiving unemployment insurance and continue to claim weekly
 - Must develop a written business plan and a market feasibility study
 - Must work full time to develop your own business
 - Must be able to obtain financial backing to fund business until it becomes self-supporting

Training Scholarships

WorkSource may be able to assist you with funding for a training program in a high-demand job.

Financing for tuition and books for a vocational training program lasting up to one year. Some of the programs available are:

- Transportation: Commercial Truck Driving & Diesel Mechanics
- Healthcare: Caregiving, Nursing and Medical Assistants
- Childcare/Early Learning Educators
- Natural Resources
- Construction
- Manufacturing
- Information Technology (IT)
- Ecommerce

Scholarship applications are submitted at least two weeks before training begins. Funding for scholarships is competitive and not guaranteed. Training must be from an approved provider

Training Unemployment Insurance (TUI)

Job search requirements are waived for unemployment insurance, so you can focus on your education.

- Eligible workers can attend school and receive UI benefits, at the same time
- Short-term training that leads to employment, usually finished within a year. This may include vocational training, finishing an Associates degree, or finishing up to 48 credits to complete a BA or MA degree
- The program does not pay for the training itself it only removes the work search requirements
- Requirements for the program include:
 - Must apply for and be approved for the (TUI) program
 - Must be eligible for unemployment insurance and continue to claim weekly
 - Attend approved training full-time each week
 - Provide grades or a certificate of completion after each term

Career Coaching

Career Coaches help you to develop an individual employment plan outlining the necessary training and support to achieve your goals.

- Your Career Coach will review eligibility and potentially provide the following:
 - Explain vocational training options, including scholarship processes and next steps
 - Review resumes and cover letters
 - Conduct mock interviews and provide feedback
 - Explore emotional intelligence and workplace challenges
 - Inform you about resources, including clothing, shelter, food and medical services
 - Provide funding for supportive services for qualified applicants
 - Offer virtual meetings upon request
